BCWA Policy 16 Membership Bear Creek Watershed Association



Statement of Basis and Purpose

The Bear Creek Watershed Association (Association) is established in the Bear Creek Watershed State Control Regulation (Regulation #74, 5 CCR 1002-74) (Control Regulation). The Colorado Water Quality Control Commission recognizes the Association as a designated Water Quality Management Agency under provisions of the Federal Clean Water Act and the Statewide Water Quality Management Plan.

The control regulation defines the Association as:

74.2 DEFINITIONS

“Association” means the Bear Creek Watershed Association formed by intergovernmental agreement and by-laws, and consisting of general purpose governments, Title 32 Districts outside incorporated areas, and permitted industry, corporations, proprietorships, and agencies or other appropriate entities within the Bear Creek Watershed.

"Districts" means all special districts in the Bear Creek Watershed who provide water and/or wastewater service, and operate a treatment facility.

Bear Creek Watershed Association Board

The Bear Creek Watershed Association has three types of membership –Members, Participants, and Mailing List Status.

- ***Membership entities*** may include all designated representatives and/or alternatives from a general-purpose government, special district and all other National Permit Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permittees (Operational Agencies) as designated by the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment in the Bear Creek Watershed.
- ***Participants*** may include entities, other than membership entities, that demonstrate vested interest and support for the Bear Creek Watershed management program as designated by the Association Board. A participant representative can represent each of the six major sub-watershed areas within the Bear Creek Watershed.
- ***Mailing List Status*** is an e-distribution list containing interested parties as approved by the Association Board, but these people, organizations, agencies are not counted as either membership or participant entities.

The Association Board reviews and approves the list of membership entities and designated participants in January of each year or as approved by the Board. The Association by-laws define membership, eligibility, and operations.

Membership Policy

1. The Association Board has determined by majority vote that the *Bear Creek Watershed Association* will consist of a maximum of 25 membership entities and 12 designated participants.
2. Membership Entities are primarily from a general-purpose government, special district and all other National Permit Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permittees

(Operational Agencies) as designated by the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment in the Bear Creek Watershed.

3. The Association Board by majority vote may designate a new member entity that is deemed eligible.
4. There can never be more participants than members on the Association Board.
5. Participants must petition the Association Board for membership.
6. Participants must demonstrate an ongoing vested interest to remain on the Association Board.
7. All permitted wastewater dischargers are expected to be and remain members of the Association.
8. Membership Entities are the primary funding source for the Association.
9. The Association will maintain a set of by-laws that define members and membership participation.
